Charitable endeavors and a year of giving

Quarterly Jeans Week fundraisers in spring, summer and early fall—Apna Ghar, Operation Save Our Troops and The Hero Initiative—collectively generated *more than \$10,000* during 2016--\$10,155 to be exact, with \$3,385 from direct MDRT staff contributions and matching funds from MDRT and the MDRT Foundation. MDRT's annual Thanksgiving Food Drive launched November 1. By holiday time, staffers collected boxes upon boxes of non-perishable food items and household staples for families in need throughout the community.

Mary Lou Jacobs' retirement was marked by accolades, a show of long-time appreciation and a photo montage on May 5 that celebrated her significant MDRT career.


